SC OSHA Reminds Employers to Post Injury and Illness Summaries February 1 through April 30

SC OSHA reminds employers to post OSHA Form 300A, which lists a summary of the total number of job-related injuries and illnesses that occurred during 2017 and were logged on OSHA Form 300, *Log of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses*. According to their website, "To assist in calculating incidence rates, information about the annual average number of employees and total hours worked during the calendar year is also required. If a company recorded no injuries or illnesses in 2017, the employer must enter "zero" on the total line. The form must be signed and certified by a company executive. Form 300A should be displayed in a common area where notices to employees are usually posted.

... A complete list of exempt industries in the retail, services, finance, insurance and real estate sectors can be found at: **Exempt Industries**. The Bureau of Labor Statistics may still select exempted employers to participate in an annual statistical survey...

Crane Operator Certification Deadline Extended

According to <u>SC OSHA's website</u>, "OSHA issued a final rule to delay compliance deadline for crane operator certification requirements to November 10, 2018. By delaying the deadline for employers to ensure that crane operators are certified by one year, and by extending the employer duty to ensure crane operators are competent until that same date, the rule avoids disrupting the construction industry and allows OSHA time to complete a related crane standard rulemaking addressing these and other issues.
